FROM THE PASTOR

In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Ephesians 3:5-6

Paul is an apostle for the Gentiles. He goes to great lengths to state this as often as possible. He is Jewish and many times he wants to be in Jerusalem and preach there, but that's not where God has called him. And the reason he has been called to preach to the Gentiles is stated here in Ephesians: the Gentiles have become fellow heirs. This is the good news of Epiphany and the celebration that we had this past Wednesday. The Magi in Matthew 2 are Gentile. Christ's call at the end of the Gospel of Matthew in the Great Commission is "to make disciples of all Gentiles (usually translated as 'nations')." Gentiles are now heirs to the amazing work that God is doing throughout history and creation.

And, we're Gentile. The covenant and the promises throughout scripture are not our birthright. They are a gift given to us because Christ has adopted us and made us fellow heirs. If these promises are not our birthright, then the only way we come to faith is through somebody telling us about Jesus: a parent, a preacher, a teacher, an apostle. This is why Paul's call is so important. He begins this preaching to the Gentiles. It's also our call too, this new year. We share our faith because it was first shared with us. We share our faith because that is the only way it is passed on to others.
