

# Teaming Up to Feed the Housebound

Left: Fresh produce is very much appreciated by the homebound elderly. In 2015, board members at Nutrition & Services for Seniors in Beaumont were kicking around the idea of starting a garden in order to offer fresh fruits and vegetables to their Meals on Wheels clients. About the same time, similar discussions were taking place across town at Wesley United Methodist Church. What has evolved from these discussions



are two gardens that have come together to help feed the homebound community of Jefferson County. Two members of Jefferson County Master Gardeners head up these gardens, and they both have the same first name.

Toni Clark was already involved with Nutrition & Services for Seniors when she was asked to oversee the garden located on the property. It was an easy decision. "We had our first planting in October

2015," Clark noted. "We only grow what the clients will want. We know what appeals to their palate. We started with 14 beds and have grown to 21 beds. We focus on high-yield crops like tomatoes, green beans, summer peas and okra."

After the vegetables are picked, they are packaged and distributed to Meals on Wheels route drivers. The drivers will then offer a package to a client, who can either accept or decline. The client can then eat it raw or cook it. None of the produce is cooked by Meals on Wheels. "We put enough for two servings in each package. We have distributed around 14,000 packages to date," Clark added.

Tony Lucenti oversees the Seeds for Needs garden at Wesley United Methodist Church. "Once we established the garden, we tried giving the produce to several organizations, but they didn't know what to do with it. I had helped set up the garden at Nutrition & Services for Seniors, so we decided (as a committee here at Wesley) to combine our garden with theirs. More people benefit that way. None of it is wasted."

Both gardens are wholly organic and use donated additives and fertilizers from Micro-Life. "They support us tremendously. We have to stay organic because of who the food is going to. Some of these people are ill, so it is important to offer good nutrition."

Both gardens have raised beds that have drip irrigation and started with beds at one cinderblock high. Two problems soon became apparent. "One block was just not high enough to hold the right amount of soil. We also realized quickly that it wasn't good enough for our backs!"

In winter, these combined gardens produce broccoli, carrots, turnips, cauliflower, beets, mustard greens and onions. The summer gardens are planted with tomatoes, corn, bell peppers, melons, cucumbers, Swiss chard, eggplant, blueberries, strawberries and blackberries. Both gardens encourage pollinators by leaving broccoli and cauliflower in the ground after they have bolted. Trellises will soon be planted with other bee- and butterfly-friendly native plants.

"Our blueberries and blackberries are phenomenal," Lucenti said. "It's unbelievable that we get so many berries from only three bushes. People are amazed at how green our gardens are. We tell them we are constantly adding organic materials, humates, compost. This soil is very rich."

Money and supplies for both gardens are all donated. Lucenti is always on the lookout for grants. He also says the Church garden will be getting beehives soon and he hopes they can sell the honey to raise funds.

Jefferson County Master Gardeners has community stronger." To

gained several new members from the community volunteers who work the gardens. "I try to teach them when they come out," says Lucenti. "Several were interested enough to go through the course and learn even more. The Master Gardener program allows me to get the education I need that benefits me and anyone else I can help."

The Church garden also hosts a Boy Scout merit badge in the spring. "I have







from 10-15 kids out here. It takes 2-3 months to finish all the steps necessary to earn the badge," Lucenti noted. "It's very rewarding."

Janci Kimball, executive director at Nutrition & Services for Seniors, sums it up: "This is a very successful partnership with the Master Gardeners. Our clients are so happy to get fresh food. One driver told us a story of a woman who was so excited to get fresh tomatoes that she started eating one before she even got it inside the house. This is truly a community effort and it makes our
