





He called a meeting of the neighbors and 5 people responded. They went in person to all of the neighbor's homes to invite them to the church. A brush arbor was built on the corner of Live Oak and Cable. The total cost of the structure was \$52.

On May 15 we will celebrate the 110<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of North End Methodist Church, now what we call Wesley. We will have 1 service at 10am on that day with Bishop Scott Jones preaching. # **FROM THE PASTOR**



SENIOR PASTOR REV. RICK

"Don't let it escape your notice, dear friends, that with the Lord a single day is like a thousand years and a thousand years are like a single day. The Lord isn't slow to keep his promise, as some think of slowness, but he is patient toward you, not wanting anyone to perish but all to change their hearts and lives." 2 Peter 3:8-9

We love the freedom to do as we like, to make our own choices. We claim the idea of freedom as essential to adulthood and American citizenship. We like the sound of the poem Invictus when it says, "I am the master of my fate, I am the captain of my soul."

In order to convince ourselves, or others, that we are our own "captain" or that we are the only one who decides the direction of our lives we will do about anything, won't we? We will even go so far as to intentionally make the same mistakes, poor decisions, and bad choices sometimes just to prove we are in control of the situation. Even when we are worn out, dog-tired, and weary, we get up each morning and try, try again. Because it feels like freedom.

One of the many reasons I am impressed with God, is that we get both the gift of freedom and the gift of failure from God. Like you, I am of course impressed by the fact God loves us enough to give us freedom, but sometimes it is hard to see failure as a gift. However, freedom and failure come in the same gift box, don't they? We love and celebrate our freedom of course, but hate being a people who fail, or at the very least, could fail. In fact, no matter how little we have paid attention to God's instruction, wisdom, and guidance we still end up blaming God when we reap the consequences of disobedience and failure comes knocking on our door.

Another reason I am impressed and give God praise is that God is patient. God must be so very patient. How else would you explain God's ability to love us so much to give us the gift of freedom and yet not give up on us when we blame God for also letting us fail? Patient with us, even when we think the consequences of our poor and disobedient choices are unjust or unfair.

2 Peter reminds us that the use of our freedom for selfish and disobedient purposes not only brings consequences into our life today—but will also be why many perish. But God is patient and has given us this time as a gift. How will you use it?



# A word about the United Methodist Denomination.

We will have a discussion on May 3, in the parlor at 6:00pm about the United Methodist Denomination. Currently, there are media outlets and plenty of voices that are talking about the future of the denomination as if they know exactly what will happen next. Many of the statements being made are either misinformed or speculative in nature. Like many, I had hoped that we would gain clarity on the future this year when General Conference, the deciding body of our denomination, was supposed to meet. However, due to covid, they have elected to postpone until 2024. This has caused some churches in the denomination to disaffiliate from the UMC and later this year new offshoots of Methodism will emerge as separate denominations.

I want church members to have the opportunity to ask questions and share their thoughts about this topic. We are not gathering to vote or make any decisions about the direction of the church. This is a chance for you to ask questions and for us to share information with each other.

Even if you are not coming to the meeting, please pray for the church. We are not sure what choices will be made available for our church yet. However, I encourage you to focus on continuing to be a great church in mission to the Beaumont area, love each other as Christ loved the church, and remember God will certainly lead us through all of this. Our mission does not stop or become less important during this time so let's focus on it until the time comes when we know more about what our options may be.

As your pastor, you might want to know my thoughts on the matter. Once again, I do not know what options we might be given or what upcoming votes may occur. But it will always be my goal to direct our church and our denomination toward a path that helps us be fruitful in our ministry and mission for Jesus Christ. There is no doubt that the issue and concern about homosexuality will the issue everyone gives for why the denomination may divide. But it and other endless debates that plague and divide our denomination are symptomatic of a lack of faithfulness to Jesus and his mission in the world. Our focus should be upon following Jesus, sharing Jesus, and being about his work. This focus that will result in unity and clarity even in times when we are divided over difficult issues. We, of course, must be willing to be counter-cultural when our faith demands it. Compromising our faith and the mission of the church in the name of tolerance or indifference is misguided to say the least. There will always be political issues that we differ on, there will always be sinful broken people within the church if we are doing our job correctly, and there will always be the temptation to blame others for the decline of the denomination. However, I think if there is to be a future in which the United Methodist Church grows, it will be a result of its members holding on to sound doctrine, following the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and being disciplined in their effort to grow the Kingdom of God. So please keep praying for our church, please stay faithful to the mission in this time of uncertainty, and please rejoice that Jesus is still Lord!
