On September 11, 2022 the Administrative Council of Wesley United Methodist Church approved the following resolution:

"After completing a period of prayerful discernment of more than 40 days, including a call to the membership for prayer and fasting, town hall meetings, publishing links to articles and videos about reasons for disaffiliation and about reasons to remain with the United Methodist Church, and after a survey open to the church membership, The Administrative Council of Wesley United Methodist Church, Beaumont resolves to request the District Superintendent to convene a church conference for the purpose of discussion and vote on whether Wesley United Methodist Church. Beaumont will disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The Administrative Council resolves further to request the District Superintendent to extend the vote to all members of the Wesley UMC, Beaumont who are present at such meeting."

The vote to determine if Wesley United Methodist Church will disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church is currently scheduled for October 9, 12pm in the sanctuary.

Please keep in mind the following:

- You must be a member of Wesley UMC and present at the Charge Conference in order to vote.
- In order to disaffiliate from the UMC, 2/3 of members present at Charge Conference must approve the resolution to do so.
- Voting will be done by ballot.
- We will have our membership roll available in worship each week prior to the vote if you would like to make sure you are currently a member. You may also contact the office of Wesley UMC to check the status of your membership.

FROM THE PASTOR



SENIOR PASTOR REV. RICK IVEY

"Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord." Isaiah 1:18

Wesley has an important vote coming up on October 9th at 12pm in the sanctuary. Please watch one of our town hall meetings and come to both the upcoming Wednesday night meetings to hear about the future of the United Methodist Church and the Global Methodist Church.

The U.M.C. will be changing in the upcoming years. It is difficult to predict when the changes will directly impact this congregation, but changes are coming. It may be 2, 4, or 10 years from now but the U.M.C. will continue to become more progressive in its theology, politics, and practice. If a more progressive church is what you have always hoped for, then you should vote for Wesley to remain in the U.M.C. and give it your full support.

If you want to see Wesley be more traditional in its theology, politics, and practice, and do not like the direction of the U.M.C., vote for Wesley to disaffiliate (leave) from the United Methodist Church and support the effort to do so. It may be tempting to wait and see what will happen in 2024 at the U.M.C. General Conference, but I believe now is the best time for Wesley to leave if it is going to leave. Wesley can currently disaffiliate and retain all property and assets for no further cost than what was promised the Texas Annual Conference for the remainder of the year. This opportunity may not be available again.

Disaffiliating from the United Methodist Church on October 9th will start the process of Wesley joining a "Wesleyan Evangelical" denomination such as the Global Methodist Church, Free Methodist Church, or one of the other options that the congregation chooses.

I encourage you to decide what you believe God wants for Wesley through prayer, scripture study, and conversation with other Christians. Be sure you are committed to supporting whatever direction you vote. Please only vote for what you are willing to support with your future prayers, presence in worship, financial gifts, service, and witness. Please don't vote for a future you have no intention of supporting. Remember church members must be present on October 9th at 12pm in the sanctuary to vote. The agenda that day is to distribute ballots, pray, vote, and determine if 2/3 majority vote needed to disaffiliate has been reached. There will be no discussion before voting as opportunities to discuss have been provided during the time of discernment. May God richly bless you all, encourage you all, and give you peace with your vote.


"It is therefore expected of all who continue (in a Methodist society) that they should continue to evidence their desire of salvation... By attending upon all the ordinances of God." John Wesley

Do you worship God? Often? In many ways? Through Sunday morning service, reading scripture, public, family, and private prayer, fasting, and celebration of Holy Communion? This is the beginning and the end of our practice of faith. Our confession and repentance of sins flows from worship and Holy Communion. Relationships with family, neighbors, and spouses are built on worship and prayer. Hope is given in times of grief and mourning whenever we fast and worship our savior. Mission work for the hungry, naked, imprisoned, sick, and impoverished is directed through the reading and preaching of scripture during worship. We are sent out of worship to participate in the good works of Christ and fulfill the mission of God's Holy Church. Then we come back to worship to celebrate, reflect, and see where God has moved through us. Worship is the beginning and the end of our practice of faith. Mr. Wesley wrote three general rules for our faith, and the third one is to 'attend upon the ordinances of God.' He lists exactly what is above: Worship. He lists exactly what the Teacher in Ecclesiastes states, 'worship God.' The ordinances are not legalistic, like the Pharisees in Christ's time. Rather, at the end of the day, to be a member in one of the early Methodist societies (think small groups or Sunday School classes), you needed to worship God, our savior. You need to recognize that Christ is due all that we have, all of our worship and praise. That was the requirement. Nothing more for membership, but most certainly nothing less.

If somebody you know has been feeling like their relationship with God is not what it once was of if you have wondered if there could be more to your relationship with Christ, let me offer one suggestion: Attend upon the ordinances of God. Come to worship and start here.
