Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers,

to angels without knowing it. Continue to remember
those in prison as if you were together with
them in prison, and those who are mistreated
as if you yourselves were suffering."

Hebrews 13:1-3

Please join us in prayer daily as we pray for our church to draw closer and be guided by God.

- **8/October/2020—Romans 8:18-**"I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us." We thank you God, that you have overcome sin and death so that our temporary problems can be faced with hope and faith.
- **9/October/2020**—**Ephesians 1:18**—"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people,.." Keep our hearts focused on you today, Lord. May we not be distracted by momentary problems and lose sight of your glory and greatness.
- **10/October/2020**—Isaiah 52:7—"How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" God, let us proclaim the greatness of your works and the hope of your salvation.
- **11/October/2020**—Galatians 5:7—"You were running a good race. Who cut in on you to keep you from obeying the truth?" Holy Spirit, guard our hearts and our witness to others. Help us to be faithful in our actions so others can know our love for you.
