

"You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its saltiness, how will it become salty again? It's good for nothing except to be thrown away and trampled under people's feet. You are the light of the world. A city on top of a hill can't be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a basket. Instead, they put it on top of a lampstand, and it shines on all who are in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before people, so they can see the good things you do and praise your Father who is in heaven."

Matthew 5:13-16

Why did anyone decide to become a Christian when it first started? Here are the biggest differences between the early Christians and the rest of the people in the world when it started.

Christians did not abort or throw out unwanted children, practiced monogamy in their marriages, and celibacy in singleness. These were not the common practices at all.

Christians were generous to the poor, multi-ethnic as a community because their identity was in Jesus not their race, were not violent or revenge seeking.

Christians had personal and loving relationship with God. Other religions of the day might offer enlightenment or instruction, but none of the others offered a close relationship with God.

Christians had assurance of eternal life—now. Other religions might offer salvation or freedom by human effort. Christianity had the good news of assurance of eternal life by grace now.

Christians were saved by free grace. No other religion, now or then, offers salvation by the grace of a savior. No secular philosophy offers it either, including "spiritual but not religious".

As we journey through this Advent season and later celebrate Christmas, remember the great gift you have been given in Christ and commit to offer more of your life into his mission and ministry.
