

This Christmas Eve, our communion rail offering will go to help the Wesley Foundation at Lamar University. The Wesley Foundation is a mission for all God's people and they are located on Lamar's campus. They serve college students by helping them find a life in Christ that leads to commitment and continued service to the Kingdom of God. They do this through weekly worship and Bible studies, campus mission work with a food pantry and meal offerings, and volunteer missions with Buckner Children's Home, Garth House, and various Disaster Relief efforts. They led the Methodist disaster relief effort after Imelda in our area. We want to support and continue to be part of the mission they are doing for Christ on the Lamar campus and beyond.

Part of the reason we are asking at this time has to do with the denominational split in the UMC. As the local conference has lost many churches, the funding for conference ministries (such as the Wesley Foundation at Lamar) will decline. We want to make sure Lamar Wesley can continue on in strength in the new year. In addition to their wonderful mission work and Christian discipleship, they also raise up young leaders in the church. They currently have a candidate for ordained ministry working at the Wesley Foundation, and a previous member of this campus ministry was a local pastor at Wesley.

We are excited for our fantastic Christmas Eve services and we are excited to partner in ministry with the Lamar Wesley Foundation with our communion rail offering.
