"For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." Colossians 1:13-14

A.W. Milne was a one-way missionary about 100 years ago. He packed his belongings in a coffin and went to a small island in New Hebrides. The island was known for headhunters and cannibals, but he was not afraid as he had already given his life to Jesus. He was there for over 35 years. When he died they buried him in the coffin he had brought and put a sign over it that said, "When he came there was no light; when he left there was no darkness."

I hope and pray that more and more people will make that kind of commitment to God. The kind of commitment that is not afraid of the consequences if it brings God glory. We live in a world that has a great deal of darkness, we need more people who can bring the light of Christ into it.

St. Paul had the same prayer for the people he knew. His prayer recorded in the book of Colossians revealed "For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God." (Colossians 1)

Who in your life do you know that needs to be delivered from darkness into light? Who needs to hear about the redemption and forgiveness that Jesus alone offers? Will you commit to praying for them for the remainder of the year?

You are awesome, God, in your sanctuaries the God of Israel who gives strength and power to his people! Psalm 68:35

Below is an image from the newly launched James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) of the Pillars of Creation. The Pillars are a massive system of clouds and gas within the Eagle Nebula where there are dozens of stars being formed. With the JWST we are finally able to see through those thick clouds to see the stars within. At the tip of each pillar a new red star is being formed and the gas that is around that new star is larger than our entire solar system. Space is big and big things happen.

When the Psalmist says in Psalm 68 that God is awesome, he means something more significant than 'it would be really awesome if the Dallas Cowboys won the Super Bowl this year.' Our God is an awesome God, powerful, strong, and a God that creates big things. The Psalmist begins with a description of God's military victories and prowess, something that is perhaps obviously awesome. But quickly he shifts to describing God's awesome power to defend the widow, provide for the poor, and freedom for the oppressed. Then at the end, he describes a wonderful worship service filled with praise for our awesome God and he urges God to show His might during worship, in the sanctuary. 'You are awesome, God, in your sanctuaries - the God of Israel who gives strength and power to his people!

We worship an awesome God. A big God. A God that creates throughout the universe, a God that creates new life for the widow, the orphan, the poor, and the oppressed. A God that can create something new in you as we worship. Do you have faith that God can do something awesome in you?

Almighty God, blessed is your holy name and blessed is the creation which you have made, from the grandeur of galaxies and nebulae to the blades of grass in our own backyards. You are awesome! Forgive us when we fail to recognize your power and strength each and every day. Summon your strength and work through our times of worship, so that we might see what you are creating in us today. And then, Lord, help us to share that new creation wherever you lead us.
