"I assure you that if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mountain, 'Go from here to there,' and it will go. There will be nothing that you can't do." Matthew 17

Mustard Seed and Mountain.

They are not proportional. The mountain takes up way more of our view than a mustard seed. The mountain appears insurmountable and if you are over 40 you probably need your readers to see a mustard seed. What's the mountain blocking out your plans right now look like? Probably covid-19 but maybe it is something else. It can be so disappointing when our plans for garage sale, VBS, or summer camp are forced to be changed. And maybe Covid-19 is not your main problem right now. Maybe it is a problem you have been facing for a long time or a question for which you cannot find an answer. Perhaps the mountain is something painful that causes you to suffer daily.

Here is a reality: The mountain is not what Jesus tells us to focus on. We are meant to use the faith we have been given and nurture it, trusting that God can move the mountain, even if we cannot. To water those seeds of faith with our worship and praise until we see God move or remove the obstacle.

Mustard seeds and mountains are not proportional in size, but they are also not proportional in potential or power. Mountains can't grow themselves. Mustard seeds have within them the potential to overtake massive amounts of land in one lifetime. Growing plants can split tough rocks in two. Just imagine what an almighty God can do.

So where will your focus be in the upcoming days. On the mountain or on the mustard seed of faith God has given you?
