FROM THE | PASTOR

“We displayed purity, knowledge, patience, and generosity. We served with the Holy Spirit, genuine love, ⁷telling the truth, and God’s power. We carried the weapons of righteousness in our right hand and our left hand.

⁸We were treated with honor and dishonor and with verbal abuse and good evaluation. We were seen as both fake and real, ⁹as unknown and well known, as dying—and look, we are alive! We were seen as punished but not killed, ¹⁰as going through pain but always happy, as poor but making many rich, and as having nothing but owning everything.”

2 Corinthians 6: 6-10

In his letters to the church in Corinth, Paul does an excellent job of presenting what life in Christ looks like. We do not find Paul trying to convince others that after becoming a Christian everything in his life became easier or difficulty and hardship went away. Rather, what we find is Paul carefully explaining that the difference was that now difficulty and hardship had purpose and meaning like he had never experienced.

His dedication and devotion to the one who had saved him, Jesus, meant he could now go through times of both being loved and hated, praised and criticized, being considered a stranger or a close friend, with an assurance that his life was being used for something greater than he had ever dreamed possible. All because of what God had done for him in Jesus Christ.

Jesus was such a brilliant treasure to Paul’s life he could not help but display the difference it was making in his life to all who merely had to observe his life to see it.

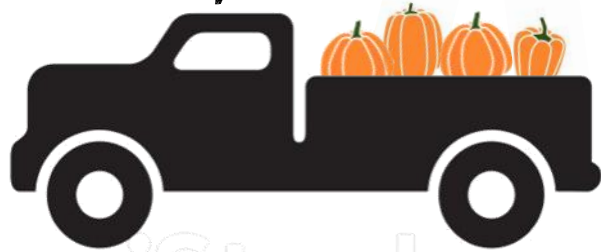
