

#### **GARAGE SALE REPORT**

We are entering a season of Thanksgiving and Goodwill, and it's the perfect time to send out this report on the Garage Sale. We had the best Garage Sale ever in 2019. One focus of the GS is for our congregation to spend time working together and growing closer while practicing their faith with action. The second focus is to use the proceeds to make a difference in our community. Historically, the Garage Sale proceeds have helped our Society of St. Stephens fund, Girls Have, Boys Haven, and the Shorkey Center. These ministries have all grown from the support of the Garage Sale over the last several years. In distributing funds in 2019, we partnered closely with Clay Thomas, the new director of Girls Haven, and George Hartsfield, the director of Boys Haven. We

desired to fund exceptional programs for the kids that could be life-changing events for them, programs they would not otherwise have in their regular budget. And that is our model for the future. These kids have been through tragic and heart-rendering situations that put a black cloud on their early life. The issue is – how do you scrub away that cloud, so they become a reasonably well-adjusted young person when they are 18 and leaving Girls or Boys Haven. These places provide positive guidance and a loving home to these kids. Our mission is to enhance the experience by providing events and trips that show the kids it's a big world out there, and there are a lot of things they can do and become part of that are a world away from what they had to live through in their early life. We are focused on providing what we term "life enhancement" experiences that have a good chance of making a difference in a kid's life. This year we distributed \$4,700 to Girls Haven to enable the 22 girls there to go to the Cirque Du Soleil performance in San Antonio and to go to Camp Butner in early 2020. In the history of Girls Haven, the trip to San Antonio was the first overnight trip they have ever done, and it was a great trip for the girls. Camp Butner is run by the Butner non-profit group north of Austin that has events to build self-confidence, teamwork, etc. We distributed \$7,500 to Boys Haven to enable the nine boys there (and a few more expected to be there) to go to Camp Butner, and to participate in the Stable Spirit program in the summer, fall, and spring. The Stable Spirit program is in Rose City and is an equine program that has proven very effective in helping people that have been through traumatic situations. Girls Haven received a grant to send the girls to Stable Spirit, so they are to participate as well.

This year we have also distributed \$10,000 to the Society of St. Stephens Fund, \$5,000 to the Habitat for Humanity Apostle's Build which we will help build on December 7th, \$1,000 to our Seeds for Needs garden for a new roof on their building, and \$4,800 to Some Other Place. Additionally, we provided a bit over \$3,000 of help for our youth to go to church camp in return for them working in the Garage Sale — a true win-win. All remaining funds will be distributed later this year.

We are able to impact our community because Wesley makes its staff and facilities available for about a month and a half, and over 100 of you come together during the year to work on this. Our Garage Sale has become a big deal in Beaumont that a lot of people look forward to, and we look forward to this continuing so we can continue to help our community and the kids within it. I feel very blessed and proud to be part of this and I am proud of our Church for providing so much support and of each of you for all you do to make this possible. If you are reading this and have not been part of the Garage Sale, I urge you to become a part of it. You can call the Church office, and they will get you linked up with a person to talk within an area of interest to you.
