### 2018 Garage Sale Report:

We have raised \$35,800 in this 2018 Garage Sale! It may be a bit higher, as we have a few things to sell that we held back.

I was really surprised. There were some things we were doing different in this Garage Sale that I felt would be a big help, but apparently they were even bigger than I had thought they would be. So – remember exactly what you did this year, we need to be able to do it again.

I did not expect to do close to that well, as we did not get the kind of furniture we did in prior years and furniture is a big driver.

I have my thoughts about what we did very well that made a difference but would like to hear your thoughts. I plan to schedule a follow-up meeting in early August that will be in the Dining Hall. We will have a morning meeting at 10 AM and an afternoon meeting at 5:30 PM to accommodate everyone. I will send out an announcement of the date as soon as I can be sure there are no other conflicts.

I would urge you to come to the meeting whether you worked in the Garage Sale or not. It's a chance to understand what this mission project is about and how big it is for Wesley and the community.

There are four important groups that make the Garage Sale – the donors, the workers, the customers and the beneficiaries. Come with your thoughts of how we can make it better for any or all of those groups.

An important part of the Garage Sale is our members having a chance to get to know each other well and work together in their faith. I felt this year was the strongest ever in achieving that. We have some excellent teams and we want to add to those and develop more. This year we had 20 youth that worked in the Garage Sale and we provided \$2,577.50 of scholarships to them toward Church Camp.

The customers had a good time and we had some that told us they wanted to copy what we are doing for their garage sale (I think we are like SW Airlines in this space, they can copy what we are doing but can't be what we are). I did not see a single disgruntled customer. We

had customers that bought \$30 of stuff and gave us \$50 and told us to keep the change – they like what we are doing.

We had some Boys Haven and Girls Haven kids working with us and we had free shopping for all the Boys Haven and Girls Haven kids on Friday afternoon. I received an email from Jade Rayburn at Girls Haven (who is part of the management there) and she said the girls who worked with us had a great time and they all loved the shopping. Jade said the girls that have been at Girls Haven a while tell the new girls about the Garage Sale as a cool event to look forward to. (Very neat, and a big accomplishment in our ministry).

Our last noteworthy accomplishment was that we found a great painting for Tim as a going away present — his last Sunday was the Sunday after the conclusion of the Garage Sale.

### The statistics for this year included the following:

We had 2100+ customers come through the sale, based on observation and the counts we have made in prior years. We had 119 people that worked in the Garage Sale, 6 of them from Boys Haven and Girls Haven, 1 a volunteer (Jesse Kibbles who saw our Channel 6 TV spot and wanted to be part of what we were doing), and the remaining 112 all members of Wesley.

A lot of us were exhausted when the Garage Sale ended, but it was a healthy exhaustion from doing God's work of being part of the Church and loving our neighbors.
